RECIPES

Since many of you have asked for our Birthday Breakfast recipes, here they are in a size for a family meal. If you ever need the recipes for number I prepare for, just give me a call!

Breakfast Casserole

8- eggs beaten	2 cups milk
Salt & pepper	1 lb sausage, browned & drained
1 cup grated cheese	8-10 slices bread

Pour milk over bread. (Make sure there is enough milk to fully soak bread). Add egg mixture, salt, pepper, sausage. Add cheese. Pour into 9X13 baking pan and bake at 350 until firm, usually 30-45 minutes. Make ahead to give the bread time to soak the egg mixture. I refrigerate over night.

Can also add chopped onions or peppers for variety or ham to replace sausage.

Hash Brown Casserole

2 lb Shredded hash browns	1 chopped onion
1 can cream of chicken soup	1 small container sour cream
salt and pepper to taste	1 1/2 cups shredded cheese

Mix together. Place in a 2 buttered 9x13 baking dish. Bake covered until potatoes are tender. Bake uncovered 10-15 minutes. (I use frozen onion found in the frozen vegetables section at Wal-Mart)

Fruit Salad

1 large cans sliced peaches, drained	2 can pineapple chunks, drained
1 can pears	red seedless grapes
2-3 bananas	1 box regular pudding mixed with 1 cup pineapple juice.

Mix pudding with 1 cup of juice drained from pineapple and microwave until thick.

Drain fruit. Cut peach slices and pears into smaller pieces. Add grapes cut in halve. Pudding mixture will be very thick but will thin when mixed with fruit. Do not add bananas until ready to serve as they will darken. If mixture is too thick, add juice from fruit until it is the consistency you want.

Only your payment will hold your seat. If you call and make reservations, please send your money immediately. Your seat will be held for seven (7) days without your deposit. Amount of deposit is listed on each trip. Day trips should be paid in full. Price of trip is based on assumption at least 30 people will travel on each day trip and 35 will travel on extended trips. If enough people do not sign up by 30 days prior to departure date and the trip cancels, you will be notified and receive your payment refund in full. Trip cancellation insurance is always included in International travel and is available for you to purchase on extended trips.

Smoking and alcoholic beverages are prohibited on the bus.

All tips and gratuities are always included in the cost of the trip for drivers, guides & services. Envelopes will not be passed on the bus.

You do not have to be a member of Pretty Big Kid's to travel with us. You may invite your friends, this helps fill the bus. They will receive the same care and service that you receive for the same price, but if there are discounts they will only go to Pretty Big Kids members.

On extended trips, one piece of luggage will be handled for you unless otherwise specified. You may take a small carry on that will stow overhead or under your seat but you will be responsible for it.

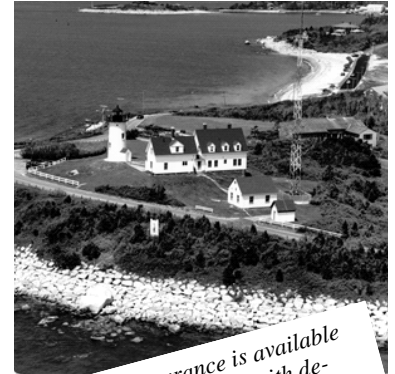

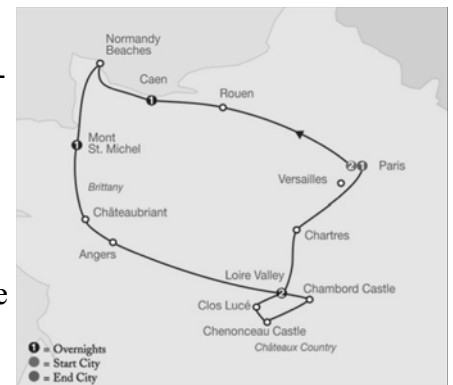

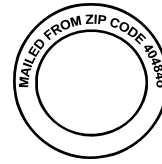
